



Your 2017–2018 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)/California Dream Application was selected for review in a process called verification. The law says that before awarding Federal Student Aid, we may ask you to confirm the information you and your parents reported on your FAFSA/California Dream Application. To verify that you provided correct information the financial aid administrator at your school will compare your FAFSA/California Dream Application with the information on this worksheet and with any other required documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA/California Dream Application information may need to be corrected. You and at least one parent must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to the financial aid administrator at your school. Solano Community College’s Office of Financial Aid may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact SCC’s Financial Aid Office as soon as possible so that your financial aid will not be delayed.

## Financial Aid Verification Frequently Asked Questions

### What is the IRS Data Retrieval Tool (IRS DRT)?

The IRS DRT allows applicants who have already filed their federal income tax returns to prefill the answers to some questions on the FAFSA by transferring data from their federal income tax returns.

### How do I use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool?

Log into your FAFSA to access the IRS Data Retrieval Tool and follow the instructions provided on the FAFSA. You should not use this tool if any of the following conditions apply for 2015:

- You filed an amended federal tax return
- Your federal tax filing status is married, filing separately
- You filed both, a federal tax return and a foreign tax return

### How do I obtain a 2015 IRS Tax Return Transcript (for tax filers) or 2015 Wage & Income Transcript (for nontax filers)?

- Get Transcript by MAIL – go to [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov), under the Tools heading, click “Get a tax transcript.” Click “Get Transcript by MAIL.” Make sure to request the “**IRS Tax Return Transcript**” and **NOT** the “IRS Tax Account Transcript.” Delivers return transcript in 5-10 calendar days via postal mail to the address of record.
- Get Transcript ONLINE – go to [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov), under the Tools heading, click “Get a tax transcript.” Click “Get Transcript ONLINE.” Make sure to request the “**IRS Tax Return Transcript**” and **NOT** the “IRS Tax Account Transcript.” Verification of Non-filing available as well. Immediately displays PDF version of the **Tax Return Transcript, Record of Account Transcript, Wage & Income Transcript and/or Verification of Non-filing**, for users to view, print, and/or save. Requires Additional authentication to establish a user account.
- Automated Telephone Request – 1-(800)-908-9946. Make sure to request the “**IRS Tax Return Transcript**” **NOT** the “IRS Tax Account Transcript.” Delivers IRS Tax Return Transcript within 5-10 calendar days.
- Paper Request Form – IRS Form 4506-T. Delivers **IRS Tax Return Transcript, Record of Account Transcript, Wage & Income Transcript and/or Verification of Non-filing** within 5-10 calendar days.

In most cases, for electronic tax return filers, 2015 IRS income tax return information is available for the IRS DRT or the IRS Tax Return Transcript within 2–3 weeks after the 2015 electronic IRS income tax return has been accepted by the IRS. Generally, for filers of 2015 paper IRS income tax returns, the 2015 IRS income tax return information is available for the IRS DRT or the IRS Tax Return Transcript within 6–8 weeks after the 2015 paper IRS income tax return has been received by the IRS. Contact the financial aid office if more information is needed about using the IRS DRT or obtaining an IRS Tax Return Transcript.
