**8. VP of Academic Affairs
Report**

Vice President Duane encouraged senators to complete the CSP (California State Prison) form if interested in attending a CSP tour.

Vice President Duane reminded senators that the March 19, 2018 Academic Senate meeting will be held at Vallejo Auto Tech.

S/P Esposito-Noy stated that VP Williams will inquire about Los Rios’ study abroad program and share the information the senate. She will also convene with President Wyly regarding this opportunity and possibly inviting a representative from a consortium to speak during a senate meeting. The main campus will implement speed bumps, stop signs, and flashing lights for walkways to increase traffic safety for students and staff. These projects were set in motion in order for SCC to receive additional state funding in the near future for similar projects. The upcoming Flex Cal will include an Active Shooter training. S/P Esposito-Noy had been in contact with Fairfield Suisun School District to inquire about their safety procedures in this type of situation. Also, she addressed safety concerns regarding classroom doors that couldn’t be locked from the inside and highly encouraged senators to discuss any safety concerns with their deans. One of the topics she will discuss during her meeting with Lucky Lofton and Lt. Brian Travis will be SCC buildings that needed immediate attention to help ensure students, faculty, and staff safety. The same topic will be included at the next SCC Safety Committee meeting.

VP Williams deferred his report during the Information/Discussion section of the meeting.

9. Consent Agenda – Action Item	There were no items on this section.
10. Action Items, Including Items Removed From Consent	Kitty Luce, a representative from Professional Development Committee, attended this meeting to present the new language incorporated in the PD rubric (see attached document). Senator Cittadino motioned to approve this document as presented. It was seconded by Senator Niffenegger. The motion passed unanimously.
11. Information/Discussion Items	
11.1 Degree Works	Greg Brown, Vice President of Student Services, presented Degree Works. This topic will be included on the upcoming Flex Cal. This system will assist students who would like to change their majors and give them the ability to review different scenarios/options. At this time, majority of the work had occurred behind the scene in preparation for March 12 th system test, April 16 th “live date”, and roll out schedule this summer and fall semesters. A few of challenges that the group recognized through this process were: (a) transfer acceptance, (b) IGETC, (c) double counting, and (d) Banner.
11.2 AB 1985 AP Scores	VP Williams presented AP/BP Advance Placement (see attached documents). The legislation AB 1985 outlined that if a college did not have an AP list that they defer it to CSU scoring. The goal of this update will be to establish procedures consistent with AB 1985.
11.3 Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) Introduction, Timeline, and Description	VP Williams stated that CCSSE (Community College Survey of Student Engagement) survey (see attached document) will be administered this semester. This effort was a result of the Accreditation process to help increase student feedback regarding their experience at SCC. The office of Superintendent-President will provide email to faculty. Faculty participation will be randomly selected, this will be optional, and a third party will administer this survey in class.
11.4 Audit Procedures with Admin Recommendations	VP Williams presented AP/BP 6010 Course Auditing and Auditing Fees (see attached documents). He stated that currently SCC had a list of auditable class. The policies will be updated to reflect non-auditable courses and to modify language to reflect Title 5. Students will need to exhaust the repeatability option before they will be allowed to audit a class. VP Williams emphasized the importance of allotting room for “actual” students. He solicited feedback from senators to be forwarded to him as soon as possible.
11.5 BP 4003 Emeritus Recommendations	Senator Young and Senator Lan presented a draft of BP 4003 (see attached document). Senator Young stated that the reference to staff

The senators had several input including: (a) item III.2 that faculty with Emeritus status will participate on SCC services by invitation only, (2) the number of semesters and units per semester required for adjunct qualify, and (3) eligibility to audit a class. Additionally, Senator Young and Senator Lan will be convene with President Wyly for more input. This document will be presented at the next Academic Senate meeting for review or/and action.</p>
<p>11.6 SCC Academic Senate Budget Update</p>	<p>Vice President Duane stated that the Academic Senate account received one-hundred-twenty-one dollars donations monthly from faculty/staff. At this time, the account balance was \$10,723.21.</p>

<p>12.1 Assessment Committee</p>	<p>Assessment Coordinator reported that there were still departments that have not completed their SLOs on META. As a result, any changes/update will be processed by the Curriculum Committee. The committee will offer two classes at the upcoming Flex Cal, which will include how to map PLOs on META. She attended a SLO symposium that emphasized on how to ignite faculty interest on SLOs, how to start this dialogue, and what processes were working to benefit students. Her contract will be due for renewal at the end of this semester.</p>
<p>12.2 Academic Program Review</p>	<p>Academic Program Review Coordinator Ferdinanda Florence stated that the committee drafted a survey and it will be presented to Academic Senate once finalized. They will be using Survey Monkey for their standardized report especially for online classes. Faculty will have the ability to add questions but not modify/delete exiting questions. She will convene with Amy Obegi to discuss a module for assessment. Lastly, she stated that the Curriculum Committee voted to modify the name of University Studies Liberal Studies of Education A.A. instead of approving inactivation of this program.</p>
