maintain required student attendance, scholastic records, and other related materials.

5. Participate in the development, assessment and evaluation of student learning outcomes (SLO) and Program Level Outcomes (PLO).

6. Participate in Program Review, participate in curriculum and program development, revision, implementation, and evaluation.

7. Develop, review, and maintain currency of curriculum.

8. Demonstrate ability and/or willingness to develop and teach online and/or hybrid courses.

9. Actively participate in department/school meetings and maintain regular office hours in accordance with the collective bargaining agreement and College and School policies; participate in college governance and decision-making.

10. Engage in department/program improvement initiatives.

11. Participate in professional development activities, both departmental and college- wide
