host public health efforts related to COVID, but building and personnel constraints complicated the possibilities. We are now looking at becoming a drive through vaccination/testing site.

CARES Act funds may allow us to purchase COVID test kits for students and employees on campus. If we can purchase vaccinations, we will do that as well (for staff and students).

Thanks to Kimo & IT for the prompt waitlist fix. Faculty concerns about waitlist logistics, capacity, functions etc were heard. There is ongoing work to be done.

VP Cooper reported on Emergency Aid: we've had high response, 128+ studnets have been awarded aid so far, 100 are also in the works. Many more students need Chromebooks (70 so far); IT is ordering more. Returning students have been keeping theirs from last semester. There is a lot of CARES act money available; send students in need to Shirley/Shannon so they can help with Chromebooks or funds. Aid money is now \$500/student.

INFORMATION/DISCUSSION

Scale of Adoption (SOA) for Guided Pathways (GP) - Michael Wyly

Our 2020 plan had already been approved, but the Chancellor's Office changed their process which means we need to resubmit our plan to the CO. The GP shift from Academic Affairs to Student Services, plus the influence of COVID, means that our plan needs revision and new recommendations for the 2020-2021 SOA, and we should reassess where we are in regards to the plan and its needs. The SOA needs to be signed by both the S/P and the Academic Senate President, so it will come to Senate for review prior.

Results of Outcomes & Actions - LaNae Jaimez

Senate reviewed the <u>list of ideas gathered at this flex breakout/event</u>; the discussion there generated a huge list of ideas for each outcome (5) with many actions we can take that are student centered to foster inclusion, comfort/safety, agency and to meet our students' needs and interests. Students were participants in the event as well.

Faculty Mentor Program - LaNae Jaimez

Senate needs to develop a process to get this program moving. Stipends are available to mentors (\$2000/mentor, one mentor per school). Senate is seeking volunteers to help develop this program.

SESC & PD/Flex Cal Coordinators/Chairs - LaNae

These two committee Chair terms are up this Spring semester. Job descriptions will be revised and posted (hopefully within two weeks) so fall schedules can be planned (release time).

Tech Committee - LaNae

The college's Master tech plan is being drafted; this plan sets the strategic direction of technology for the college (policies, procedures, standards). Senate has three appointees to the committee: if Senators don't fill all three seats, the spots will be opened up to all faculty. Senate is seeking volunteers to serve.
