Campus Sheriff's Office Crime Beat



• <u>Attempted Robbery</u> – On April 7, 2017, at 2:43 p.m., Campus Sheriff's Office deputies responded to parking lot #1 of the Fairfield campus on reports of, "shots heard". Responding deputies arrived within minutes after receiving the "911" calls and spoke to witnesses. After a preliminary investigation the deputies determined that both the suspect and victim had left the college in an unknown direction. There were no injuries or damages to nearby parked vehicles.

An investigation was launched to determine what happened on that day and also to apprehend those responsible for this crime. The investigation revealed that both parties were NOT students at the college. They met here to conduct a sale transaction for a laptop. The suspect tried to rob the victim of his cash and shot at the victim as the victim was running away.

On April 14, 2017, the Sheriff's Office Investigations Unit was able to identify the suspect and MADE the ARREST. The suspect is now in custody and will be held to answer for his crime.

Crime Beat Tips

- ✓ The above incident proved that anytime you use the internet to make a purchase or sell an item to always insist on meeting at a public place like:
- In front of a police/fire station, a café, shopping center or a government building.
- Do not meet in a secluded place, or invite strangers to your home or work.
- Tell a friend or family member where you are going and who you are going to meet up with. Also make sure you will have your cell phone with you.
- Be especially careful buying/selling high value items.
 Consider having a friend or two accompany you. Trust your instincts.
- ✓ If you are working or studying late, arrange to leave with a friend or call Campus Sheriff's Office at 707-580-6526 (Fairfield Campus), 707-580-4936 (Vallejo Center) or 707-580-6054 (Vacaville Center) for Safety Escort assistance.
- ✓ And always, if you see anything or anyone that is acting suspicious, contact the Campus Sheriff's Office in Building 1800 B or call us at (707) 864-7131.


Health Screening exams are available at the Student Health Center for Children's Program students. Drop-in or make an appointment for your Health Screening.


