Crime Beat Tips

- ✓ Remember, it is against the law to alter, forge, sell or loan your parking decal to another person or to reproduce your decal. You will be cited for the offense.
- ✓ Protect yourself from **Phishing attacks**. Phishing is the single most common method of cyberattack. **Phishers** typically create fake emails that appear to come from someone the victim trusts: banks, credit card companies, or popular websites, for example. These emails can trick the reader into giving away sensitive information, such as usernames, passwords, or sensitive personal information. If you receive an email from any bank, credit card company, etc. asking you to click on a link or supply them with your personal information, **DO NOT** click on the link or give them any information. Once you click on the link supplied by the Phisher, a computer virus will be allowed to download into your computer and all your information will be harvested and sent back to the Phisher. If you receive suspicious emails, don't open them.
- ✓ If you are working or studying late, arrange to leave with a friend or call Campus Sheriff's Office at 707-580-6526 (Fairfield Campus), 707-580-4936 (Vallejo Center) or 707-580-6054 (Vacaville Center) for Safety Escort assistance.
- ✓ And always, if you see anything or anyone that is acting suspicious, contact the Campus Sheriff's Office in Building 1800 B or call us at (707) 864-7131.

TYPING TEST CERTIFICATES SOLANO COLLEGE - FALL 2017

Do You Need a Typing Certificate for a Job, Class, or Just Want to Know Your Typing Speed and Accuracy?

You can take a typing test and receive a certificate immediately at the Solano Community College Main Campus in Fairfield!

The 5-minute typing test is given in Rm 502, on Fridays
11:00am-3:30pm on the following dates:

October 6, 13, 20, & 27
November 3 & 17
December 1, & 8



There is no cost for the test, you just need to bring some form of identification with a picture.

Typing Certificate will show your words per minute/how many errors/ and signed by a proctor.

If you need a placement test for registration into a course please email patricia.ceja@solano.edu with your name, SCC ID number and course you are interested in registering for and a placement test will be scheduled for you. You must already have completed the application process for the college.
