

INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES

Program Description

This major is designed for students who are not certain of their specific academic major goals and do not have immediate transfer plans. It would enable them to earn the Associate Degree by completing general education and an 18-unit area of academic focus.

- I. All students will complete the Solano College Option A GE Pattern: Minimum 22 semester units.
- II. All students will complete an 18-unit Area of Emphasis from the selections below.
- III. Electives may be necessary to total 60 overall units required for the Associate degree.
- IV. All courses for this major must be completed with a grade of C or better or a P if the course is taken on a Pass/No Pass basis.

Program Outcomes

Students who complete an Associate Degree will be able to:

1. Discern the relationship between personal perspective and evidence-based evaluation of information.
2. Discover the nature and common themes of the disciplines represented by an academic area of emphasis.
3. Acquire a knowledge base that encourages lifelong learning in order for them to effectively adapt to a complex and changing society.

Areas of Emphasis

1. 18 units required from one Area of Emphasis listed below.
2. Courses selected cannot also be used to fulfill GE areas.
3. Courses numbered 1-49 transfer to UC, CSU and most independent and out-of-state colleges. Courses numbered 50-99 transfer to CSU and some independent and out-of-state colleges and universities. Courses numbered 100-199 are associate degree applicable but usually do not transfer to baccalaureate-granting institutions.

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INTERDISCIPLINARY STUDIES – SCIENCE AND QUANTITATIVE REASONING

Minimum 18 units required

Minimum six units from Science and six units from Quantitative Reasoning

Chemistry courses may be used as either Science or Quantitative reasoning but not in both.

This emphasis is intended to involve inquiry into the physical universe and its life form with consideration of facts and principles which form the foundations of living and non-living systems. Students will explore scientific methodologies as investigative tools, the acquisition and use of evidence, and the past and present influences of science on world civilizations. Understanding and analysis of basic mathematical and quantitative reasoning concepts will be explored. This area includes courses in areas such as computer science, math, and science.

Course work will explore behavior - sometimes the behavior of an individual, other times the behavior of a system, society, or culture. Topics and discussion will stimulate critical thinking about ways people have thought and acted in response to their upbringing, environment and society.

JOURNALISM – ASSOCIATE IN ARTS IN JOURNALISM FOR TRANSFER

Program Description

Journalism teaches critical thinking and communication skills that enable students to translate events and issues of importance accurately and responsibly. The Associate in Arts for Transfer (AA-T) in Journalism is intended for students who plan to complete a bachelor's degree in Journalism, Mass Communication, Public Relations or Advertising at a CSU campus. Students completing this degree (AA-T in Journalism) are guaranteed admission to the CSU system, but not to a particular campus or major.

Associate in Arts in Journalism for Transfer

Students will gain first-hand experience of journalism through practicum on the student newspaper, The Tempest, and its online version Solanotempest.net, and in some cases through placement in internships in the industry. Students learn the ethics and laws associated with journalism, as well as develop an understanding their own First Amendment rights.

To earn this Associate in Arts in Journalism for Transfer degree, students must:

1. Complete 60 semester units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University, including both of the following:
 - a. The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education – Breadth Requirements.
 - b. A minimum of 18 semester units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district.
2. Obtain a minimum grade point average of 2.0.

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KINESIOLOGY – ASSOCIATE IN SCIENCE IN KINESIOLOGY FOR TRANSFER

Program Description

The Associate in Arts in Kinesiology for Transfer degree is designed to provide a seamless transfer pathway for students interested in pursuing at least one Kinesiology degree option in the CSU system.

Associate of Science Degree

Successful completion of the Associate in Arts in Kinesiology for Transfer degree prepares students to transfer into the CSU system and work in the sub-fields of Kinesiology. Students will learn about human functioning during sport and exercise, how exercise science and biomechanics is integrated into exercise program development, and observation and assessment of human performance. The Associate in Arts in Kinesiology for Transfer degree can provide students with the foundational knowledge necessary for transfer to a 4-year Bachelor of Science (BS) or Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree program. Students are encouraged to meet with a counselor to develop their educational plans as degree options and general education requirements vary for each university.

To earn this Associate in Arts in Kinesiology for Transfer degree, students must:

1. Complete 60 semester units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University, including both of the following:
 - a. The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education – Breadth Requirements.
 - b. A minimum of 18 semester units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district.
2. Obtain a minimum grade point average of 2.0.

Associate in Science in Mathematics for Transfer

The Associate in Science for Transfer is especially appropriate for students who plan to complete a bachelor's degree in Mathematics at a CSU campus. Students completing an AS-T degree are guaranteed admission to the CSU system, but not to a particular campus or major. 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PHYSICS – ASSOCIATE IN SCIENCE IN PHYSICS FOR TRANSFER

Program Description

The focus of this program is on developing an understanding of and appreciation for the basic laws of our physical universe. This is done largely through the development of conceptual understanding, problem solving skills, and laboratory investigations. The Physics 006,007,008 sequence is a three-semester offering in introductory physics requiring math through calculus. This sequence satisfies the lower division physics requirement for majors in physics, chemistry, geology or other physical sciences, and engineering. Physics 006 is a study of mechanics, gravitation, vibration and fluids. In Physics 007, students will cover the topics of electricity, magnetism, wave motion, and sound. In Physics 008, students will cover heat, optics, relativity, and modern physics. Students will learn to analyze and solve problems appropriate for this level. Experiments relating to the topics covered will be performed.

Associate in Science in Physics for Transfer

The Associate in Science in Physics for Transfer, which aligns with the physics TMC, will prepare students for a baccalaureate degree in physics. It consists of the courses necessary for beginning physics students to be able to succeed in the upper division physics courses that they will encounter in the CSU system, or any institution (such as the UC system) that grants an undergraduate physics degree. This preparation for success will be achieved through students mastering the student learning outcomes for individual courses, as well as the outcomes for the overall program.

To earn this Associate in Science in Physics for Transfer degree, students must:

- Complete 60 semester units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University, including both of the following:
 - The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education – Breadth Requirements.
 - A minimum of 18 semester units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district.
- Obtain a minimum grade point average of 2.0.

ADTs also require that students must earn a C or better in all courses required for the major or area of emphasis. A “P” (Pass) grade is not an acceptable grade for courses in the major.

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POLITICAL SCIENCE – ASSOCIATE IN ARTS IN POLITICAL SCIENCE FOR TRANSFER

Program Description

This program examines the theory and practice of government and the powerful personalities that affect governmental decisions. This interplay of individual citizens, public leaders, elections, and world events make political inquiry relevant today. The program provides a broad base for the analysis of how government resolves social conflict within the United States and around the world.

Associate in Science Degree

Upon completion of the Associate in Arts in Political Science for Transfer Degree, students will be eligible to transfer to a CSU undergraduate Political Science program. The Associate in Arts in Political Science for Transfer Degree will facilitate successful transfer to the CSU system, allowing students to complete baccalaureate degrees in a more timely fashion.

To earn this Associate in Arts in Political Science for Transfer degree, students must:

1. Complete 60 semester units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University, including both of the following:
 - a. The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education – Breadth Requirements (37-39 units) (5.5-21 CSU Transferable Electives)
 - b. A minimum of 18 semester units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district. (19-26.5 units)
2. Obtain a minimum grade point average of 2.0.

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PSYCHOLOGY – ASSOCIATE IN ARTS IN PSYCHOLOGY FOR TRANSFER

Program Description

The psychology program provides academic instruction in basic psychological concepts, theories, terminology, and research methods, and promotes life skills, personal growth, and interpersonal effectiveness.

Associate in Arts in Psychology for Transfer

The Associate in Arts in Psychology for Transfer is especially appropriate for students who plan to complete a bachelor's degree in Psychology at a CSU campus. Students completing an ADT degree are guaranteed admission to the CSU system, but not to a particular campus or major. Students transferring to a CSU campus that does accept the ADT will be required to complete no more than 60 units after transfer to earn a bachelor's degree. This degree also prepares students for psychology degree programs at other four-year institutions, but does not come with the same guarantees. In all cases, students should consult with a counselor for more information on university admission and transfer requirements.

To earn this ADT degree, students must:

- Complete 60 semester units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University, including both of the following:

- Courses numbered 50-99 transfer to CSU and some independent and out-of-state colleges and universities.
- Courses numbered 100-199 are associate degree applicable but usually do not transfer to baccalaureate-granting institutions.

Elective Units

Electives may be necessary to meet the 60-unit requirement for the Associate Degree.

Program Outcomes

Students completing an Associate Degree will be able to:

1. Develop a pattern of thinking and a knowledge base consistent with the scholarship required to pursue further study in a major at a university.
2. Discover the nature and common themes of the disciplines represented by an area of emphasis
3. Examine the relationship between personal perspective and evidence-based evaluation of information.

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UNIVERSITY STUDIES – ARTS AND HUMANITIES

Minimum 18 units required

Minimum six units from the Arts and six units from Humanities

Maximum three units of credit for studio/performance courses

These courses emphasize the study of cultural, literary and humanistic activities and the artistic expression of human beings. Students will evaluate and interpret the ways in which people through the ages in different cultures have responded to each other and the world around them through artistic and cultural creation.

Majors at a 4-year institution appropriate for this Area of Emphasis include but are not limited to: Classical Civilization, Design, Dramatic Arts, Film Studies, Literature, Music, and Philosophy.
