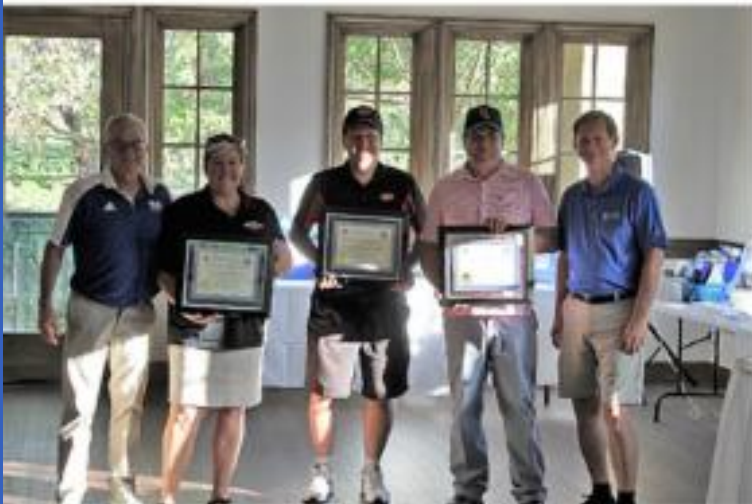

## Pro Golf Tournament Comes to SCC





Professional tennis players from around the world came to SCC last week and over the weekend for the \$100,000 NorthBay Healthcare Men's Pro Championship.

A total of 16 single qualifier matches took place during the week with two Americans, who are top seeds, in the 32-player field, including a young Tennessean who may have the best name in sports: Tennys Sandgren.

At the University of Tennessee, Sandgren led the Volunteers to the 2011 NCAA team finals as a freshman. He is currently ranked 97th in the world.

Joining him was Ernesto Escobedo, a 20-year-old Californian from West Covina who comes in at No. 90 in the USTA rankings.

Altogether, 10 Americans faced off against a field that included players from Germany, Serbia, Belarus, and Australia.

The finals for both the singles and doubles championships were held yesterday.
