## **Understanding Gender Project**



Students in Psyc 012 Psychology of Gender class this semester embarked on a class project that uses a GENDERBREAD person to show that gender is a function of expression, identity, biological sex, and romantic and sexual attraction. These terms reference the Gender Binary, which is the idea that there are only two genders (male & female) and that there is only femininity or masculinity. They include terminology and definitions; flags seen on the board, also known as "pride flags" are representative of the attractions and identities of those in the LGBTQ+ community. They understand that the list is not an exhaustive list of labels for those in the LGBTQ+ community; terminology is infinite and deeply personal to the individual. Many of these labels may have different definitions for different individuals. Many feel empowered by finding a label they identify with, while others do not feel the need to label their identity- both decisions are equally valid and should be always be celebrated. #### **Greenwood is Athlete of the Month**



Sophomore middle blocker Destiny Greenwood was recognized as the Solano Athletics November Athlete of the Month, announced Tuesday. This is Greenwood's second honor as she was named Co-Athlete of the Month for September.

In the month of November, Greenwood earned a slew of honors including being named All-Northern Region, Most Valuable Player of the Bay Valley Conference (BVC), First Team All-BVC, and finished the year as the state leader in kills.

Greenwood will be transferring to a NCAA Division I school with a full-ride scholarship to continue her athletic and academic career, marking her as the second player under head coach Darla Williams to move on to a Division I school.

### Athletics Update...

<u>Women's Basketball</u>: The Solano women's basketball hosted the annual Solano Showdown over the weekend. Included in this year's field was Delta, Shasta, Chabot, Feather River, Los Medanos, Lassen, and Cosumnes River.

A trio of Falcons score 13 points each to lead the Solano women's basketball team to a 70-48 rout of Cosumnes River in the Solano Showdown opening round on Friday evening.

Sophomore **Sunmi Da Silva** along with reserves sophomores **Lexi Hines** and **Elizabeth Martinez** paced the Falcon offense with Da Silva adding four assists and Hines and Martinez each counting seven boards each. Martinez also contributed three assists and five steals.

Freshman Jada Scott also reached double-figures with 10 points and seven boards.

The Solano women's basketball team outscored Lassen by 13 points in the fourth quarter to erase a 10-point halftime deficit to take the 71-64 semifinal win in the Solano Showdown on Saturday evening.

Sophomore **Elizabeth Martinez** paced all Falcon players with 14 points, adding 11 rebounds. Sophomores **Lexi Hines** and **Kameron Hatcher** and freshmen **Vanessa Hughes** and **Jada Scott** rounded out the players in double-figures with 12, 11, 10, and 10, respectively. Scott added four assists and five steals, while Hughes earned four steals.

The Solano women's basketball team finished second in the Solano Showdown behind sophomore **Kameron Hatcher**'s 11 points in the team's 80-43 loss to San Joaquin Delta on Sunday afternoon. Sophomore **Elizabeth Martinez** and freshman **Jada Scott** were named to the All-Tournament squad.

Martinez led the Falcons with six rebounds with Scott adding five. Hatcher counted six steals to lead all players.

The Falcons (7-7) head to Contra Costa next on Wednesday, Dec. 19 for a 5:30 p.m. game.
