Tournament Play Set for Basketball



Solano Community College Lady Falcons never trailed and outscored Laney in all four quarters to close the season with a 65-44 Bay Valley Conference victory, Friday.

The Falcons finished up 17-10 overall and 12-4 in the BVC, good enough for third place.

Coach Matt Borchert said Solano was “well balanced, as usual” with RJ Johnson contributing 11 points, four rebounds, five assists and six steals, Sunmi Da Silva 11 points, three rebounds and four steals, Liz Martinez 10 points and eight rebounds, Destiny Greenwood nine points, nine rebounds and two assists, Lizzy Roark seven points and eight rebounds, and Kameron Hatcher seven rebounds, five of them offensive, six points and four assists.

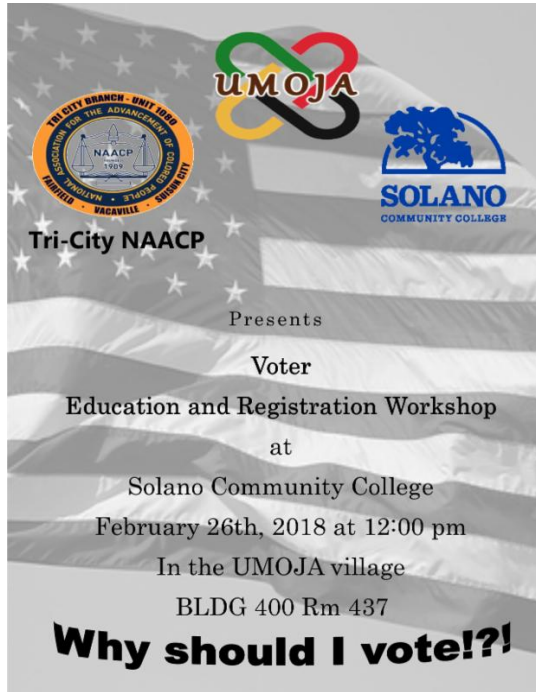
As mentioned in the story above, Roark and Johnson were named to the State All-Academic team, the only two players from the BVC among the 34 selected.

As for the season, Borchert said it went “pretty good; 17-10 is nothing to sneeze at or whatever the cliché is. It was solid even with 11 freshmen and with some injury issues.”

SCC will host a women's basketball playoff this Wednesday, February 20 at 7pm. We are ranked 16th and will play Shasta.

The Solano men wrapped up their season with an 86-85 win over Alameda, finishing up 10-17 overall, 5-11 in the BVC. No stats were available.
