A Message from the Superintendent-President

Thank you to everyone who cooperated during Monday's bomb threat. We took the calls seriously and I made the decision to evacuate all three campuses. For those who were to hold their final 8-week session class on Monday, please work with your dean on best options for affected students.

On Wednesday the management team met with the Sheriff's Office for a comprehensive debrief of Monday's incident and our response. A summary of that debriefing is forthcoming from Lt. Travis.

In the coming weeks, SCC will make available a new, free app for faculty, staff, and students that will allow you to contact 911, receive urgent messages, and request police assistance using your phone or wireless device from any location. This is one more step we are taking to support everyone in feeling safe on campus.

Award-winning Author to Speak at SCC Today



Award-winning television personality and author Cheryl Wills will speak at Solano College today at 12:30 p.m. in the Theatre.

Wills, the prime time anchor for NY1 Live at Ten and host of public affairs talk show In Focus with Cheryl Wills on Spectrum News NY1 in New York City, is the author of three books about her great-great-great-grandfather Sandy Wills who fought in The Civil War: Die Free: A Heroic Family Tale, an illustrated children's book, The Emancipation of Grandpa Sandy Wills and a young adult book, Emancipated: My Family's Fight for Freedom.

Wills was the first journalist invited to speak before the General Assembly of The United Nations in March 2011 about the impact of slavery on her family during the UN's International Remembrance of Victims of the Transatlantic Slave Trade and is the Founder and Commander of the New York Chapter of the Sons & Daughters of the United States Colored Troops, a national organization based in Washington, D.C.

At today's presentation, Wills will speak about finding her roots and how knowing where

she came from has contributed to her success, lead a discussion on underrepresented populations, discuss the benefits of community colleges and the importance of faculty and staff in a student's journey to achieving their goals. After her presentation, there will be a question and answer session.

The purpose of this high school outreach event is to promote problem solving and an enjoyment of math, while providing the students with an opportunity to experience the Vacaville Center campus.

Teams of high school students from Vacaville, Will C. Wood, Buckingham, Winters, Fairfield, and Benicia High Schools competed in a problem solving course consisting of ten stations. At each station, students were presented with a challenging and fun problem for which they had fifteen minutes to solve with a collaborative effort. Some of the concepts students applied to solve the problems were order of operations, dimensional analysis, systems of equations, and area formulas, while other puzzles required creativity in design or logic.
