Speech & Debate Team Brings Home 1st Place

Congratulations to the SCC Speech and Debate team which took home 1st Place in Overall Individual Events Sweepstakes, a 2nd Place Sweepstakes in the Two-Year Community College Division, Top Overall Speaker and more than 20 top three event placings at the Big Little City Invitational October 19-21 in Reno.

The team competed against more than 20 colleges and universities from California, Oregon, Utah, Nevada and Idaho.

Solano student Mo Azpeitia entered six open level events and placed 1st place in all six. Solano has now placed 1st or 2nd overall school at every tournament this year. This honor is even more special since this tournament marks our first travel tournament of year in which we brought a small team comprised of only our top competitors.

The next tournament is the Mustang Invitational & Paul Winters Invitational held at Delta Community College and University of the Pacific on November 2-4. 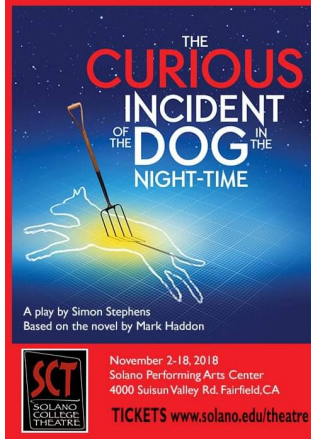
