We also have some interim positions that have been filled. They are:
Dr. Damany Fisher, Director for Inmate Education and Reentry Services will be on a leave of absence through October and Chor Thao will serve as the interim director during his absence. Chor and the staff are located in the S.O.A.R. (Students Overcoming Adversity and Recidivism) Office at the Vallejo Center.

Gema Leon has been selected as the interim Director of the ASTC (Academic Support and Tutoring Center). This is a new position that will work in conjunction with faculty member Maria Isip-Bautista who has a 50% assignment in the ASTC. Gema has been working in the ASTC and previously worked in the Reading/Writing Lab.

NetTutor Now Available to Students

In addition to the tutoring services provided in the ASTC, Solano Community College is excited to announce and offer NetTutor as a free online tutoring service to our online students beginning this fall semester. NetTutor is available, 24/7, 365 days a year to assist students with their tutoring needs. Students will be able to interact with live tutors online, drop off a paper for review and feedback, or ask a question.

NetTutor offers audio and video captioning during live sessions to fit different student learning needs and is available for students to access at a later date through his or her personal NetTutor Locker. All NetTutor features are available on mobile platforms, which include iOS, Android, and Windows 8 or 10. Students that use the "Ask a Tutor a Question" feature will also utilize WorldWideWhiteboard, which offers a variety of tools for editing on a web-based white board.
