Assistant Coach Heading to Hall of Fame



Assistant basketball coach Ann Talamantes-Ristow, is heading to the Vallejo Sports Hall of Fame.

She has made a huge impact coaching basketball, badminton, volleyball and softball at Hogan and Jesse Bethel high schools as well as Solano Community College.

Teaching young women and men over the past three decades will guide her next month to the Dan Foley Cultural Center where she will be inducted into the Vallejo Sports Hall of Fame.

Talamantes-Ristow has been an assistant coach for the Solano College women's basketball team that has won conference championships in 2014, 2015, 2017 and 2019.

"At Solano, you only have two years as opposed to Hogan where you would have a lot of the girls for four years," Talamantes-Ristow said. "So you have less time to teach and execute what you want in the program. It's much more advanced, but also more fundamental. But I like working with all the other coaches there. It's been great learning from them and having my thoughts and input backed up by them. That's been very rewarding."


Head women's basketball coach, Matt Borchert said he's glad Talamantes-Ristow is headed to the hall of fame and that "she's been a fantastic person and fun to be around" while at Solano.

"She's creative and innovative and is always staying up with the times," Borchert said. "She relates to everyone in general and comes up with great ideas for motivation. She's a good role model for all of our players over the years. She's a great coach to talk to on the road trips we take. She's also great at keeping track of things like timeouts, player fouls and such. She's been a steady presence for us since she got here."

Former Basketball Coach Inducted into

USF Hall of Fame



Former SCC women's basketball coach Joy Boyenga-Woods will be inducted into the University of San Francisco Hall of Fame.

She will be honored this month when she is inducted into the Dons' Athletics Hall of Fame.

The 1989 West Coast Conference Freshman of the Year and a 1992 co-WCC champion, Boyenga-Woods finished her San Francisco career among the program's top-10 in eight statistical categories. She's still ninth in points (1,397) and fifth in rebounds (752). At 5-foot-11 with touch from long distance, Boyenga-Woods was a stretch four before such a term even existed.

<u>Women's Basketball:</u> A quintet of Falcons scored in double figures to lead the women's basketball team to a 103-56 win over Laney on Friday evening for Sophomore Night. Sophomore **Vanessa Hughes** paced the Falcon offense with 17 points, adding six rebounds, six assists, and four steals. Freshmen **Lexi Derf** and **Ashmeen Sran** each posted 16-point nights, and freshmen **Savannah Lopez** and **Cherika Rafan** scored 14 and 10 points, respectively.

The Falcons honored the team's three sophomores Hughes, **Jada Scott**, and **Sophia Del Rosario**, who played in their last regular season game at home.
