## Esposito-Noy Featured in Comstock's Magazine

Comstock's Magazine recently published an article on SCC Superintendent-President Celia Esposito-Noy as part of its 2020 Women in Leadership series.

An excerpt from the article:

*Celia Esposito-Noy, superintendent and president of Solano Community College, sees higher education institutions as responsible for serving much more than just their students. The "academy," she says, should be a place for public discourse in society — especially the difficult conversations — and for hope.*

*"That's one of my goals in working here, and working in the community colleges in general, is that we offer hope to the community, and I think that is a key characteristic of successful leadership," she says. "People don't want to follow folks who aren't hopeful." One of Esposito-Noy's proudest professional accomplishments has been SCC's Inmate Education Program, which provides inmates access to "face-to-face" college courses inside a handful of state prisons and juvenile detention facilities. Launched in 2015, the program now serves 4,000 students. "(These) folks are re-entering the community," she says, "and we want them to be skilled and knowledgeable and successful because we know that reduces recidivism."*


