Presenters: Jim DeKloe & students	Solano College's Stem Cell Program This session will explore Solano College's Cell and Gene Therapy certificate (the first of its kind in the country) and several grants that Solano College received to teach cell therapy (including the production of CAR-T cells, a cure for cancer), gene therapy (the production of viruses to deliver genes to treat children with genetic disorders), stem cells (cells that can specialize to form tissues or organs), gene editing technologies (like CRISPR), and synthetic biology. Solano College has formed close relationships with the California Institute for Regenerative Medicine (the voter-funded state stem cell agency), Stanford's Laboratory for Cell and Gene Medicine, the UC Davis GMP stem cell production facility, UC Davis Continuing and Professional Education, and the national Manufacturing USA Institutes NIIMBL (www.niimbl.org) and BioMADE (www.biomade.org).
