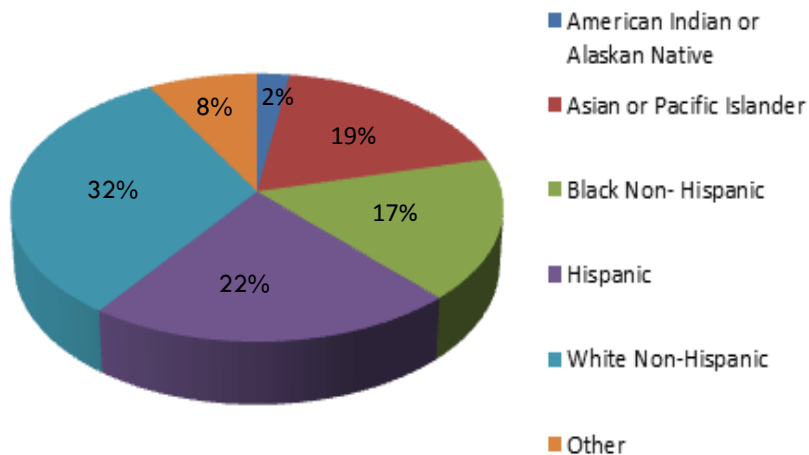

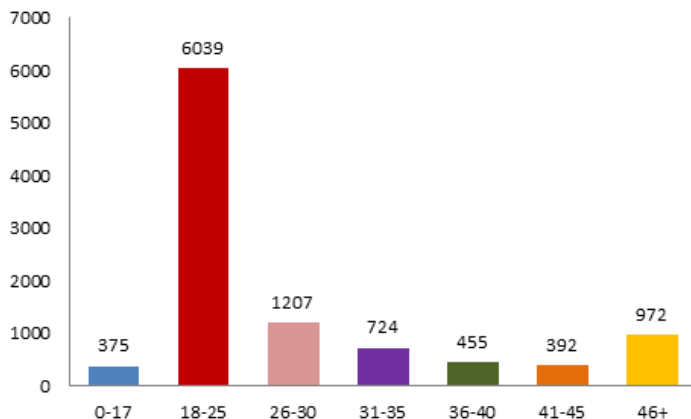

Number of Spring 2013 Enrollment by Age

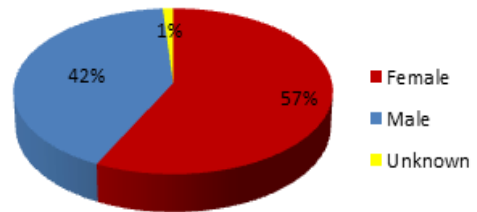

2013 Enrollment by Gender

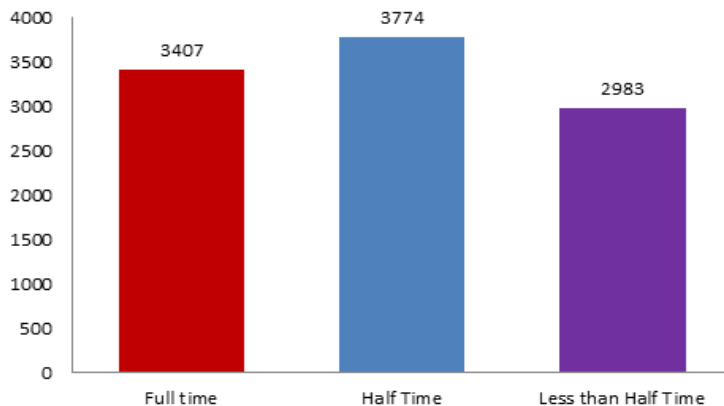

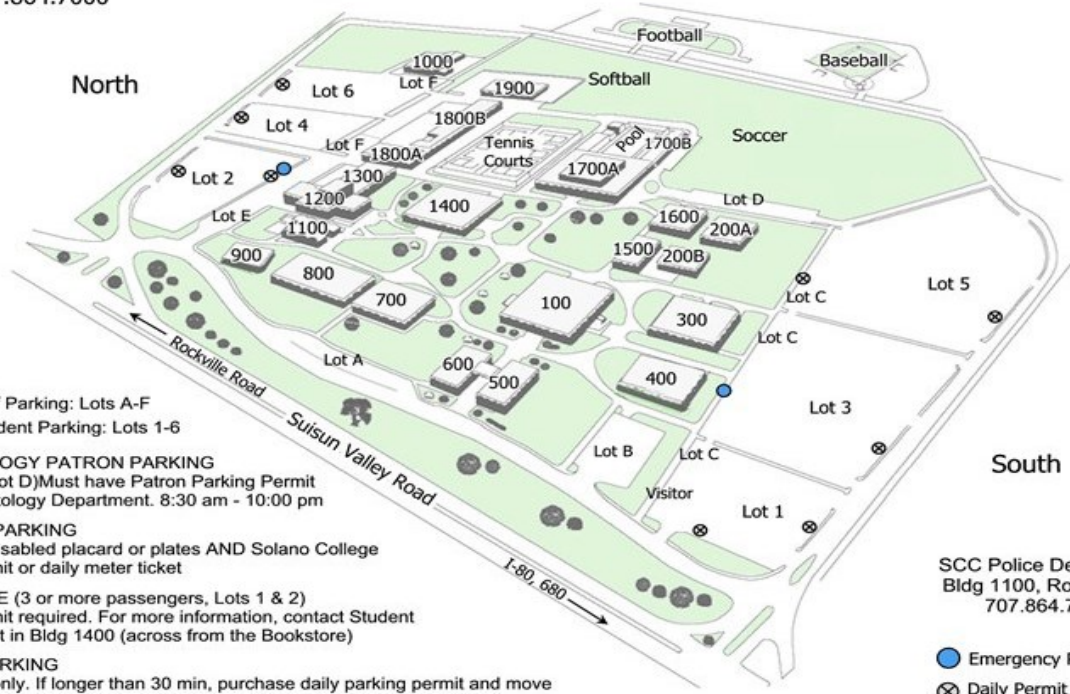
Number of Spring 2013 Enrollment by Day, Evening, & Weekend Classes
