1. Meeting is called to order at 1:07 pm

2. Overview of statewide AS Equity Workshop (9/26/14)

- ◆ There was good representation from SCC
 - Shirley and several other committee members attended the workshop.
- ◆ Student Equity Funding - \$70M statewide
 - Divided up by Student Equity Success indicators
 - SCC: \$413,839 total allocation
 - Napa: \$254,000
 - Contra Costa District (3 campuses): \$1.4M
 - To get the money we must maintain the Student Equity Plan
 - Must be updated annually
 - Next month we will get a new memo
 - July's memo: we must add more low income, vets, foster youth
 - Need data from each group
 - Outline plan for all groups (what we hope to do)

3. New plan is due January 1 (including these new groups)

- ◆ Need to have approved plan for accreditation
- ◆ Must meet and reflect the purpose
- ◆ All expenditures must be based on disproportional study (see tables in Student Equity Plan appendices)
- ◆ A one-sheet summary per summary would be easier to read
- ◆ Include multi-racial groups
 - Banner doesn't collect this data this way
- ◆ CCC Apply data – does it feed into Banner, breaking down various racial categories by gender as defined in US 2010 Census?
- ◆ New Senate Bill SB 860
 - Adds on to legislation – goals and objectives for each of these population groups
 - Requires coordination of DSP, ESL, EOP, MESA, Middle College HS, Puente, Foster Youth, Vets, CalWORKs, Financial Aid and Basic Skills initiative
 - How do we get Student Equity to include all these plans by January
 - Starting 2016 – detailed accounting of how funding was spent and assessment of achieving goals.

4. Funding

- ◆ Come up with considerations and criteria for funding
- ◆ Make sure we are maximizing the use of these funds
 - How to be efficient and maximize

- Don't use for small groups of students
- Think big – start small
 - phase out late registration but have late start classes to retain FTEX
 - don't spend money on early alert SW (faculty does better)
 - intervention needs a person
 - new faculty orientation can help
 - We need resources on campus (including evenings)

5. How to allocate \$314k funds

- ♦ Giving freedom to coordinate use of funds allocated to their areas
- ♦ Come up with a project you want to submit – include criteria
 - Example: Umoja: hire student success coaches who could work with all students
 - Course retention
 - Match by age, major, gender
- ♦ Money must be spent by June 30
- ♦ We have several already successful areas now
 - Umoja, MESA, ASC – but staff leaves for the day and students have to be kicked out
- ♦ Those who want money need to outline where in the plan it fits
