Program Structure

The EDCE degree completion program combines video and web-based delivery, coupled with face-to-face cohort discussion. Classes are facilitated by a cohort instructor, who will guide students through each class and provide full academic support throughout the program. Students take two courses per semester for eight semesters, including fall, spring and summer—finishing in three years.
