7.2 Plenary Recap

Plenary attendees shared a recap of their experience.

Josh: Plenary was a great opportunity to collaborate with colleagues. It was helpful to hear that other colleges are experiencing some of the same challenges as Solano. It also provided a chance to learn new ideas. One interesting topic was about AI and the growing need to establish campuswide AI policies. There was a breakout session on AB 1705, which focuses on 'upscaling' support for students pursuing STEM majors. Additionally, a resolution was passed in support of part-time faculty. Another resolution addressed the issue of fraudulent enrollments. Resolution 113.01 focused on proposed changes to the Brown Act as it pertains to academic senates. Other resolutions covered topics such as Rising Scholars, parity in lab work and compensation, and more. The Spring 2025 Plenary Resolutions packet is available online on the Resolutions Process webpage.

LaNae: Some of the most interesting information shared involved upcoming changes related to transfers and ADTs. One impactful session focused on AI, highlighting the clear need for related policy work on our campus. It may be valuable to involve students in the development of AI policies. Another insightful session addressed the role of liaisons. While Solano currently has an OER liaison, we should consider providing additional liaisons, such as a part-time faculty liaison and a legislative liaison.

Rachel: One engaging session focused on RSI (Regular and Substantive Interaction), encouraging faculty to emphasize learning outcomes more broadly. Solano appears to be addressing RSI effectively through the DE Committee. Another insightful session explored hiring practices, offering a look at strategies used by other colleges—such as 'cluster hiring'. A highlight of Plenary was the unanimous vote in favor of the resolution on sanctuary campuses, which was approved by acclamation.

9. VP of Academic Affairs Report

David Williams

- We are making accreditation-related progress on RSI and SLO assessments, thanks to the efforts of Laura Maghoney, Andrew Wesley, and LaNae Jaimez.
 It is crucial for faculty to complete their SLO assessments so the results can be utilized in the fall semester. Completing assessments is not enough—we must also use the data to drive meaningful changes and improvements.
- Second-level interviews are currently underway for faculty hiring, and some positions have already been filled.
- Earlier this month, a Credit for Prior Learning (CPL) workshop was held. A
 new recommended procedure was introduced, and we may update Solano's
 CPL process accordingly. While it is important for counselors to recommend
 CPL to students, faculty can also support this effort by staying engaged with
 student outcomes. We are encouraged not just to mention CPL, but to
 actively promote it. CPL presents a valuable opportunity to attract
 prospective students, especially working adults.
- Applications are currently being reviewed for the Assessment & Program Review Coordinator positions.

10. VP of Student Services Report

Lisa Neeley

- Commencement will take place on May 22 at 6:00 PM. Faculty are encouraged to participate and assist. Currently, approximately 400 students have registered. Snacks will be available in the baseball clubhouse for participating faculty.
- Solano qualifies as a Hispanic-Serving Institution (HSI), making us eligible to apply for federal grants. A task force will be formed to explore what this HSI designation truly means and how we can leverage it to better support and serve our students.
- Solano is also eligible for designation as a Black-Serving Institution, as we meet the 10% Black student population requirement. This designation also comes with potential grant opportunities.
- Solano has launched a "care team" called BRIDGE (Building Relationships, Intervention, and Development for Growth and Equity) to triage students of concern. A dedicated email address, bridge@solano.edu, has been created to allow employees to refer students facing academic, behavioral, or other challenges. The team will then assess the situation and connect the student with appropriate support services, such as academic counseling, basic needs assistance, or behavioral health support. This

initiative does not replace the Early Alert program, which remains focused solely on academic interventions.

- The Student Equity & Achievement (SEA) Plan 3.0 is due November 30 and will remain in effect through 2028. The current equity plan is wrapping up. For SEA 3.0, data is being reviewed, feedback is being gathered and focus groups will be formed. More information will be shared at the May 12 Academic Senate meeting.
- Student Services board policies and procedures are currently under review.
 While some require only brief updates, others are undergoing a more indepth review over the next month.
- April is both Arabic Heritage Month and Pride Month. Several programs and events have been held in celebration. Also, additional staff has been added to support the Pride Center.
- The 4th Annual EquityFest will take place on Friday, May 2. The keynote speaker is Lasana Hotep from UC Berkeley. Sessions will cover a range of topics, including SLOs, relationship-building, Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) initiatives, and a panel discussion about the Solano to Montgomery trip. Everyone is welcome!

13. Information/Discussion Items

13.1 Dual Enrollment Taskforce Recommendations

The document, <u>"Dual Enrollment Taskforce - Recommendations made at March 12,2025 Meeting"</u> was reviewed and discussed. It is important that faculty and administrators are aligned on this topic. Other discussion points included the following:

- Could it be feasible to establish an early college program at the Vallejo Center? In the past, space limitations have been a concern. Any future discussion would need to involve the school district. In addition to the program in Fairfield, Vacaville currently offers some college classes on a high school campus.
- A focus on dual enrollment in Vallejo may be especially beneficial in reaching prospective students in the local community.
- CTE programs could be a strategic avenue to engage high school students who might not otherwise consider attending college. Career exploration opportunities may help attract these students.
- Are we truly reaching the students who would benefit most from traditional dual enrollment programs? The ECHS program on the Fairfield campus already has limited enrollment and may not serve Solano's broader student outreach goals.
- It may be helpful to reference dual enrollment in the upcoming SEA Plan.
- High school counselors will play a key role in promoting dual enrollment to all students, not just those enrolled in honors or AP courses.
- Professional development will be necessary for faculty who are interested in teaching dual enrollment students.
- It is important to consider the various models of dual enrollment, as each has its own unique processes and implications.

LaNae Jaimez, Academic Program Review Committee Coordinator, provided an update on the Academic Program Review for Spring 2025, including the review schedule, details about the streamlined process, planned improvements, and committee needs.

13.3 ZTC Update

Atticus Frey

- Utilizing our second ZTC grant, the following programs will transition to ZTC: Business, Economics, and ASL.
- A faculty survey is being conducted to assess understanding of ZTC and gather input on topics such as how to effectively promote ZTC courses

- to students. A panel discussion focused on cost reduction—featuring both faculty and students—is planned for the fall.
- The program pathway website currently features Anthropology and Spanish as ZTC program pathways. However, not every course in these pathways will be ZTC; at least one ZTC course will be available in each.
- Courses that do not require a textbook but do require supplies can still be considered ZTC. Additional costs should be clearly communicated to students.
- The ZTC webpage is currently undergoing a redesign.
- At a recent Student Material Cost Reduction Taskforce meeting, discussion topics included the bookstore contract and related issues.
