- a. Suggests that posters be made mapping all levels of each building and its escape routes in the case of an emergency.
- b. All buildings and rooms should be equipped with visible, accessible specific instructions on how to take cover or proceed during emergencies as well as specific life-saving procedures (CPR, how to tie a tourniquet...).
- c. Presented an example of an emergency pack with a portable bucket.
- d. Dr. Lewis suggests a canvas shell be made so all students may access SCC Youtube videos about important "how-to" items and skills.
 - Possibility for SCC to have another drill.
- e. ASSC may discuss Steven's idea with the DPS and there is potential to sponsor a workshop with Chief Travis as a host to teach about safety.
