- 2. Indigenous People's Day (Oct 13) and Native American Heritage Month (Nov)
  - a. Indigenous Heritage Month planning will soon begin. Gabi convening.
- ii. More inclusive policy on Club Advisors
  - 1. Research local that allow non-faculty to be advisors. Consider proposing a policy for SCC to remove barriers to club formation. Lack of available advisors is currently adversely affecting this.
  - 2. Club Advisor/Student Organization handbooks possibly undergoing revision.
  - 3. Explore status of qualified non-faculty being designated "certificated employee" so they can serve as Club Advisor. (We have 1 or 2 employees currently pursing this.)

### iii. Others?

- 1. Possibility of a Peace Pole at SCC: A monument to peace in multiple languages. Former SCC biology faculty and current Cordelia Rotary Club President pitched this to Com St. Germain, who shared with Gabi B. and Amanda M. SESC members expressed interest and support. Rotary Club will fund. Request needs to move through proper channels via Student Services team.
- 2. Michael R's idea to publish "Student Equity Success Stories" drawn from student experiences in which SCC employees helped them succeed through equity-informed practice. Collaboration between T4E and SESC?
- e. Future SESC "study sessions" (consciousness-raising "think tank" approach) topics?
  - i. Interest in focusing on immigration issues and, specifically, history and context for "sanctuary." Possible collaboration with ASSC, who began advocating for "sanctuary" status and college policy protecting our undocumented and mixed-status-family students last school year.
  - ii. Also interest in study session pertaining to Latino students and SCC's emerging status as HSI.
  - iii. We could offer "sessions" during SESC meetings and scale them up through the Center for Educational Excellence in order to offer professional development for all employees.
  - iv. Interest in looking at data pertaining to drops in enrollments and students accessing financial aid because of Trump Administration anti-immigrant polices. Patrick. S. will help us look at this.
  - v. Interest in spreading awareness about and supporting SCC's ESL offerings. Possible drop in enrollment due to Trump Administration anti-immigrant policies.
