- RFI shall provide qualified supervisory labor at the job site. Idle time incurred by RFI employees due to absence of required escorts, clearances, inability to enter the workspace, or other factors beyond our control, shall be considered a change to the contract.
- 4. Customer will provide access to all areas, including escorted areas such as computer, telephone, equipment and fabrication rooms.
- 5. RFI assumes no responsibility or warranty for equipment supplied and or installed by others.
- 6. Bond provisions are not applicable.
- 7. RFI requires written notification of any existing environmental hazard (i.e. asbestos, lead, etc) that RFI personnel could be exposed to while providing this system. Each area of concern will require separate notification. RFI is not responsible for any abatement, disposal or handling of any hazardous material (i.e. asbestos, lead, etc). All responsibility and cost associated with handling of any hazardous materials will be the responsibility of others.
- 8. The labor rates used for this project are based on standard industry rates. No provision has been made in the event that State, Federal or Any prevailing wage is required. Additional labor charges may be necessary if prevailing wages are required.



- 9. All servers and workstation computers with appropriate operating systems and database software and licenses will be provided by customer.
- 10. If additional readers surpass current license capacity, customer is responsible for acquiring additional licenses.
- 11. Customer will provide client software and workstation computer for the access control system. RFI will perform programming from the local workstation. The client is responsible for assisting RFI with network setup and install programming required to add the new workstation to the existing server.
- 12. Programming for the Systems provided will be limited to basic functions detailed in RFI scope of work. Customer will be responsible for user desired configurations for hardware, alarm map, software (door groups, schedules, clearance codes, alarm events, etc.) and personnel / cardholder database entry and programming for the system.
- 13. RFI will utilize the existing access control panel and power supplies. If spare reader ports, or necessary power supply capacity are not available to accommodate the addition, a change order will be required to complete this contract.
- 14. Internet, cellular service or adequate communication services to be provided by customer.
- 15. Network equipment and connections other than that addressed and provided in the scope of work will be provided, installed, programed and configured by others.
- 16. New or Existing POE or POE+ Switches and/or Ports shall be provided and installed by others. Adequate ports and Power for each IP device will be made available by customer. RFI will connect the new devices to an open port on existing video equipment. Lack of an open port will constitute a change to this contract. All network switches must support PoE in IEEE standard 802.3af and 802.3at power.
- 17. The customer will be responsible for providing the IP addresses, subnet, gateway information and identifying the ports on the customer network for connection of equipment provided for this scope of work.
- 18. Electrified locking hardware shall be supplied and installed by others.
- 19. If applicable, Customer will inform RFI prior to our work of any doors being operated by Auto operators.

 Additional Hardware will be required that is not included in our scope of work. Additional hardware & Power & Modules maybe required by the Door Contractor / Supplier.
- 20. If applicable, Customer must provide proper working Electrified door hardware. All new or existing hardware is presumed to be in good working condition and remains the responsibility of the customer. Any hardware found to be non-working or insufficient for the needs of the system will be replaced as necessary but will require a change order to be issued prior to any additional work being completed. - 21. If applicable, all electrified hardware is to be wired from the Electrified door hardware to the power transfer hinge by the door hardware provider.
- 22. If applicable, all Electrified door hardware is to have the built in RX switch installed, and to be wired Common normally open.
- 23. All conduit, raceways, cable trays, back boxes, sleeves, trenching, cabling pathways, and/or cores shall be supplied and installed by others.



- 24. If cabling is installed by others, RFI will need a detailed map with the cables labeled according to the map.

Solano Community College & Grand Canyon University Concurrent Enrollment Pathway Agreement

This Agreement is entered into by and between Grand Canyon University ("GCU"), an Arizona nonprofit corporation, with its principal place of business located at 3300 West Camelback Road, Phoenix, Arizona 85017 and Solano Community College ("Partner") with its principal place of business located at 4000 Suisun Valley Road, Fairfield, California 94534 (the "Agreement"). This Agreement refers to GCU and Partner collectively as (the "Parties"). This Agreement shall replace or supersede all other agreements between the Parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein expressed, the Parties do hereby agree as follows:

PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT. GCU and Partner wish to enter into an agreement in which in return for the promises contained herein GCU shall offer a scholarship to Partner's students subject to the terms of this Agreement. The scholarship shall apply to online and local cohort students who are concurrently enrolled in partner Associate Degree in Nursing program and a GCU RN to BSN ("BSN") or a GCU Bridge to Master of Science Nursing ("MSN" to be known as the Concurrent Enrollment Pathway (the "CEP").

PERFORMANCE BY PARTNER. Partner shall work with GCU to create and make available to Partner's students marketing materials which describe the CEP and provide qualifying students at Partner's facilities with all relevant information regarding the CEP. Partner shall also provide any additional services that may be listed in Exhibit A to this Agreement

PERFORMANCE BY GCU. GCU shall provide the content, instruction, and academic oversight of the above-mentioned CEP including concurrent enrollment requirements, course requirements, and requirements for matriculation into the BSN or MSN. GCU shall also provide the services listed in <u>Exhibit A</u> to this Agreement.

TERMS OF AGREEMENT. This Agreement shall be effective when signed by all Parties and shall remain in effect until the earlier of (a) three (3) year from the date of the last signature below, or (b) the termination of this Agreement by either party in accordance with the terms below. Either party may terminate this Agreement with sixty (60) days written notice. In the event this Agreement is terminated, any student enrolled in the CEP at the time of termination will be permitted to continue their studies and complete the programs under the terms specified in this Agreement. This Agreement contains the entire understanding of the Parties and replaces all other agreements or understandings, written or verbal, which may be in effect between the Parties relating to the subject matter herein.

FINANCIAL AID FOR PARTNER'S CURRENT STUDENTS. Under U.S. Department of Education code 34 CFR 690.11, Federal Pell Grant payments are limited to one institution meaning, students are not entitled to receive Federal Pell Grant payments concurrently from more than one institution. Students entering GCU while in attendance at another university would be subject to cost of attendance limitations potentially resulting in an overlapping loan scenario, which would create a large out of pocket expense for the student. Overlapping loans will impact students awarded aid from semester-based institutions (block tuition and semester-based funding) as GCU participates in borrower-based aid (eamed credits and weeks of instructional time). Students are awarded aid for the duration of the academic year. Students are not eligible to receive concurrent aid between two schools in this scenario.

FIRST TIME NCLEX_RN PASS RATES. Used by state boards of nursing, accrediting bodies, and nursing programs, first-time NCLEX-RN pass rates are a strong indicator of nursing program quality. As such, GCU evaluates the NCLEX-RN pass rates of prospective and current community college partners on an on-going basis and utilizes this data as a primary criterion for initiating or dissolving an educational partnership. Nursing programs must maintain an NCLEX-RN first-time pass rate of greater than 80% in any calendar year.

Any school who is disciplined/sanctioned by their respective board of nursing or accreditor must notify GCU's College of Nursing and Health Care Professions within 10 days of the sanction. Support will be provided to current community college partners who fall below an 80% first time pass rate with the understanding that in order to continue the partnership nursing programs will have one year, or (4) testing cycles, to bring their first-time NCLEX-RN pass rate at or above 80%.

EXHIBIT A Performance of Services by GCU and Solano Community College

GCU offers content, instruction, and academic oversight of the Concurrent Enrollment Pathway (the "CEP") known as the RN-BSN ("BSN") or Bridge to Master of Science in Nursing ("MSN").

The CEP courses will follow the outlines of concurrent courses shown in the attachment <u>Exhibit B</u>. As improvements are made to the related degree programs, the courses may change, however, credit hour requirements will follow the specifications of the current catalog.

GCU Requirements Include:

- 1. GCU shall grant eligible Partner student intenders a scholarship rate of \$250 a credit hour for the courses required to complete the CEP which is a reduction in the undergraduate tuition as shown in the current GCU University Policy Handbook (the "UPH") (the "Partner Scholarship"). This Partner Scholarship shall be available as long as the Agreement is in place and student maintains eligibility in the CEP. GCU reserves the right to change the pricing in its UPH at any time and the Partner Scholarship will be applied only as an offset to tuition stated in the UPH. The Partner Scholarship cannot be used in conjunction with any other scholarships, awards, promotions and/or other programs offered by GCU. The Partner Scholarship applies to all eligible Partner students who apply to GCU for the CEP on or after the effective date of this Agreement. GCU shall provide a welcome page to Partner for students interested in learning more about GCU's CEP offering with Partner.
- 2. GCU shall provide marketing literature and informational sessions in collaboration with Partner to promote the CEP and support student educational goals. GCU shall also include the CEP in its general marketing efforts and, at the request of Partner, shall conduct periodic marketing efforts specifically targeted at potential students for the CEP. GCU shall also conduct all necessary public relations activities designed to enhance and further the status and reputation of the CEP with Partner's prior consent, and which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 3. GCU shall provide a local University Development Counselor to act as a primary contact, Partner resource, and information session/event host.
- 4. GCU will provide all necessary student advisement to ensure student success during the CEP and necessary coordination with Partner processes.

Partner Requirements Include:

- 1. Partner shall announce the formation of the alliance with GCU to appropriate student intenders to the CEP and shall work with GCU to communicate to appropriate students the benefits of programs offered by GCU.
- 2. Partner shall provide communication to known intenders for the CEP to GCU and will include GCU in recruitment efforts.
- 3. Partner shall allow access to present information regarding the CEP with GCU to Partner students via information meetings as appropriate when there are groups of students interested in pursuing a CEP option.
- 4. Partner shall also work with GCU to provide outreach to potential students, including but not limited to informational webinars, posting of flyers, profiling in Partner's newsletters, and other activities as appropriate.
- 5. Partner will provide appropriate clinical space / experiences / skills labs for student involved in the CEP with GCU according to the clinical requirements necessary to sit for the NCLEX-RN exam and obtain RN licensure in the State of California. These services and measures will be provided in a timely manner to ensure completion of the program.
- 6. Partner will notify GCU of the CEP student acceptances, withdrawals, leave of absences, suspensions, or failures as relates to student groups/cohorts that may affect student progress in the GCU required coursework so long as such student has consented to the release in writing.

7.	Partner will identify / designate point of contact for the CEP to provide coordination with GCU appointed personnel on administrative, advising, and student service support to partner students.

This Renewal Agreement is between **University Retirement Community at Davis**, **Inc.** (hereinafter known as Health Center) located at **1515 Shasta Drive**, **Davis**, **Ca 95616** and **Solano Community College** (hereinafter known as *SCHOOL*) and located at **4000 Suisun Valley Road**, **Fairfield**, **California 94534-3197** and is effective as of November 1, 2023.

RECITALS

- A. HEALTH CENTER owns and operates an assisted living and skilled nursing care facility (hereinafter referred to as "Facility").
- B. SCHOOL owns and operates a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) and/or Home Health Aide (HHA) Program which is accredited by the California Board of Registered Nursing. SCHOOL desires its students to obtain practical experience at HEALTH CENTER's Facility through participation in a clinical program for its CNA or HHA students ("School").
- C. It is to the mutual benefit of the parties to this Agreement that the students of SCHOOL's Program use such Facility for their clinical experience.

Now, therefore, the parties agree as follows:

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

- A. Both parties before the beginning of the training shall agree upon the period of time for each student's clinical experience.
- B. The maximum number of students to receive training shall be mutually agreed upon by the parties at least 30 days prior to beginning of training based upon the availability of space and other considerations.
- C. Faculty and appropriate facility staff will arrange for faculty and student orientations, and identify a process for ongoing communication between the facility and the school at the beginning of each clinical experience.
- D. Faculty and appropriate facility staff will annually review the appropriateness of the learning environment in relation to the program's written objectives.

2. SCHOOL'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. <u>Student Profile</u>. *SCHOOL* shall complete and send to *HEALTH CENTER* a profile for each student enrolled in the Program which shall include the student's name, address and telephone number, driver's license number and social security number, prior to the beginning of the planned clinical experience.
- B. <u>Schedule of Assignments</u>. *SCHOOL* shall notify the *HEATH CENTER* of its planned schedule of student assignments, including the name of the student, level of academic preparation and length and dates of clinical experience prior to the planned clinical experience.
- C. <u>Program Coordinator</u>. *SCHOOL* shall designate a faculty member to coordinate with a designee of *HEALTH CENTER* in the planning of the Program to be provided students.
- D. <u>Records</u>. *SCHOOL* shall maintain all personnel and academic records of the students.
- E. <u>Rules and Regulations</u>. *SCHOOL* shall enforce rules and regulations governing the students that are mutually agreed upon *by SCHOOL* and *HEALTH CENTER*.
- F. <u>Supervision</u>. *SCHOOL* shall supervise all instruction and clinical experiences for students assigned in groups at the *HEALTH CENTER*.
- G. <u>Health and Background Policy.</u> SCHOOL shall provide HEALTH CENTER, prior to a student's arrival at the HEALTH CENTER, with proof of immunity consistent with HEALTH CENTER employee health policy and notify the HEALTH CENTER if student is a known carrier of an infectious or communicable disease. If such information indicates that patients of HEALTH CENTER would be placed at risk if treated by a particular student, HEALTH CENTER reserves the right to refuse to allow such student to participate in the clinical experience at the HEALTH CENTER.
- H. <u>Student Responsibilities</u>. *SCHOOL* shall notify the students that they are responsible for:
 - 1) Following the clinical and administrative policies, procedures, rules and regulations of *HEALTH CENTER*.
 - 2) Arranging for their own transportation and living arrangements when not provided by *SCHOOL*.
 - 3) Arranging for and assuming the cost of their own health insurance.

- 4) Assuming responsibility for their personal illness, necessary immunizations, tuberculin test, and annual health examination.
- 5) Maintaining confidentiality of patient information. No student shall have access to or have the right to receive any medical record, except when necessary in the regular course of the clinical experience. The discussion, transmission or narration in any form by students of any patient information of a personal nature, medical or otherwise, obtained in the regular course of the Program is forbidden except as a necessary part of the practical experience.
- 6) Following dress code of the *HEALTH CENTER* and wearing name badges identifying themselves as students.
- 7) Attending an orientation of the *HEALTH CENTER* provided by its staff and instructors.
- 8) Providing services to the HEALTH CENTER's patients under the direct supervision of a faculty provided by *SCHOOL* or HEALTH CENTER-provided staff/preceptors.
- Payroll Taxes and Withholdings. SCHOOL shall be solely responsible for any payroll taxes, withholdings, workers' compensation and any other insurance or benefits of any kind for students, employees, and agents of SCHOOL providing services under this Agreement. SCHOOL shall defend, indemnify, and hold HEALTH CENTER harmless from all liability and responsibilities therefore.

3. HEALTH CENTER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. <u>Clinical Experience</u>. *HEALTH CENTER* shall accept from *SCHOOL* the mutually agreed upon number of students enrolled in the aforementioned Program and shall provide said students with supervised clinical experience.
- B. <u>HEALTH CENTER Designee</u>. HEALTH CENTER shall designate a member of HEALTH CENTER's staff to participate with the designee of SCHOOL in planning, implementing and coordinating the training Program, including orientation.
- C. Access to Facilities. HEALTH CENTER shall permit students enrolled in the Program access to HEALTH CENTER Facilities as appropriate and necessary for their Program, provided that the presence of the students shall not interfere with the activities of HEALTH CENTER. Facilities

- includes space for clinical conferences and access to *HEALTH CENTER's* Medical Library.
- D. <u>Withdrawal of Students</u>. *HEALTH CENTER* may request *SCHOOL* to withdraw from the Program any student who *HEALTH CENTER* determines is not performing satisfactorily, or who refuses to follow *HEALTH CENTER*'s administrative policies, procedures, rules and regulation. Such request must be in writing and must include a statement as to the reason or reasons why *HEALTH CENTER* desires to have the student withdrawn. Said request shall be complied with within five (5) days of receipt of same. *HEALTH CENTER* reserves the right to suspend from participation immediately any student who poses an imminent danger of harm to patients or others.
- E. <u>Emergency Health Care/First Aid</u>. *HEALTH CENTER* shall, on any day when student is receiving training at its Facility, provide to students necessary emergency health care or first aid for accidents occurring in its Facility. Except as provided regarding such emergencies, *HEALTH CENTER* shall have no obligation to furnish medical or surgical care to any student. Students will be financially responsible for all such care rendered in the same manner as any other patient.
- F. <u>Staffing.</u> HEALTH CENTER shall provide staff adequate in number and quality to insure safe and continuous health care services to patients. Student shall perform in a training capacity only and shall not be utilized to treat patients in lieu of trained professionals employed by the HEALTH CENTER.
- G. <u>Supervision</u>. In situations of single preceptorships/internships, *HEALTH CENTER* shall assume daily supervision of student.

4. AFFIRMATIVE ACTION AND NON-DISCRIMINATION

The parties agree that all students receiving clinical training pursuant to the Agreement shall be selected without discrimination on account of race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, disability, marital status, gender, sexual orientation, age, or veteran status.

5. STATUS OF SCHOOL AND HEALTH CENTER

It is expressly agreed and understood by SCHOOL and HEALTH CENTER that students under this Program are in attendance for educational purposes, and such students are not considered employees of HEALTH CENTER for any purpose, including, but not limited to, compensation for services, employee welfare and pension benefits, or workers' compensation insurance.

6. INDEMNIFICATION

- A. SCHOOL agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless, HEALTH CENTER and its affiliates, its directors, trustees, officers, agents, and employees from and against all claims, demands, damages, costs, expenses of whatever nature, including court costs and attorney fees arising out of or resulting from negligent or intentional acts or omissions of the SCHOOL, its officers, employees, agents or its students.
- **B.** HEALTH CENTER agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless SCHOOL, its officers, agents, employees from and against any and all claims, demands, damages, costs, expenses of whatever nature, including court costs and attorney fees arising out of or resulting from negligent or intentional acts or omissions of the HEALTH CENTER, its agents or its employees.

7. INSURANCE

- A. The SCHOOL shall procure and maintain in force during the term of this Agreement, at its sole cost and expense, insurance in amounts that are reasonably necessary to protect it and HEALTH CENTER against liability arising from or incident to the use and operation of the HEALTH CENTER by the SCHOOL's students and naming HEALTH CENTER as an additional insured.
- B. Coverage under such insurance shall be not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for each occurrence and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) aggregate for each professional liability insurance and comprehensive general liability insurance.
- C. The SCHOOL shall also maintain and provide evidence of workers' compensation and disability coverage as required by law.
- D. The SCHOOL shall provide HEALTH CENTER with a certificate of insurance evidencing the insurance coverage required under this section and providing for not less than thirty (30) days written notice to the HEALTH CENTER of the cancellation of such insurance. The SCHOOL shall promptly notify the HEALTH CENTER of any cancellation, reduction, or other material change in the amount or scope of any coverage required hereunder.

8. TERM AND TERMINATION

- A. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall be effective as of the date first written above, and shall remain in effect for three (3) years thereafter.
- B. Renewal. This Agreement may be renewed for subsequent three (3) year terms, by either party giving the other at least 30 days prior written notice of their desire to renew, and the other party's agreeing to such a renewal prior to the expiration of the then current term of the Agreement.

C. Termination.

- 1) <u>Mutual Agreement</u>. This Agreement may be terminated at any time upon the written concurrence of the parties.
- 2) Without Cause. This Agreement may be terminated without cause with 30 days prior written notice by either party. Such termination shall not take effect, however, with regard to students already enrolled until such time as those students have completed their training for the school semester during which such termination notice is given.

9. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- A. <u>Amendments</u>. This Agreement may be amended at any time by mutual agreement of the parties without additional consideration, provided that before any amendment shall become effective, it shall be reduced to writing and signed by the parties. Notwithstanding the foregoing, should any provision of this Agreement be in conflict with a governing State or federal law, it shall be deemed amended accordingly.
- B. <u>Assignment</u>. Neither party shall voluntarily or by operation of law, assign or otherwise transfer this Agreement without the other party's prior written consent. Any purported assignment in violation of this Section shall be null and void.
- C. <u>Attorney's Fees</u>. In the event that any action, including arbitration, is brought by either party to enforce or interpret the terms of this Agreement, the prevailing party in such action shall be entitled to its costs and reasonable attorney's fees, in addition to such other relief as the court or arbitrator may deem appropriate.
- D. <u>Captions</u>. Any captions to or headings of the articles, sections, subsections, paragraphs, or subparagraphs of this Agreement are solely for the convenience of the parties, are not a part of this Agreement, and shall

- not be used for the interpretation or determination of validity of this Agreement or any provision hereof.
- E. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all such counterparts together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- F. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement, including all Attachments, is the entire Agreement between the parties and no other agreements, oral or written, have been entered into with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement.
- G. <u>Force Majeure</u>. Neither party shall be liable nor deemed to be in default for any delay or failure in performance under this Agreement or other interruption of service or employment deemed resulting, directly or indirectly, from acts of God, civil or military authority, acts of public enemy, war, accidents, fires, explosions, earthquakes, floods, failure of transportation, machinery or supplies, vandalism, strikes or other work interruptions beyond the reasonable control or either party. However, both parties shall make good faith efforts to perform under this Agreement in the event of any such circumstances.
- H. Governing Law. The validity, interpretation and performance of this Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- Notices. Notices required under this Agreement shall be sent to the parties by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, at the addresses set forth below:

- J. Remedies. The various rights, options, elections, powers, and remedies of the respective parties hereto contained in, granted, or reserved by this Agreement, are in addition to any others that said parties may be entitled to by law, shall be construed as cumulative, and no one of them is exclusive of any of the others, or of any right or priority allowed by law.
- K. <u>Severability</u>. The provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed severable and if any portion shall be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable for any reason, the remainder of this Agreement shall be effective and binding upon the parties.
- L. <u>Waiver of Provisions</u>. Any waiver of any terms and conditions hereof must be in writing and signed by the parties hereto. A waiver of any term or condition hereof shall not be construed as a future waiver of the same or any other term or condition hereof.
- M. Compliance with Law and Regulatory Agencies. HEALTH CENTER and SCHOOL shall comply with all applicable provisions of law and other valid rules and regulations of all governmental agencies having jurisdiction over: (i) the operation of the HEALTH CENTER; (ii) the licensing of health care practitioners; and (iii) the delivery of services to patients of governmentally regulated third party payers whose members/beneficiaries receive care from HEALTH CENTER. This shall specifically include compliance with applicable provisions of Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations. SCHOOL shall also comply with all applicable standards and recommendations of the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, bylaws and rules and regulations, and policies and procedures of HEALTH CENTER its Medical Staff and Medical Staff departments.

2. LABOR CODE/WORKERS' COMPENSATION: Contractor needs to be aware of the provisions which require every employer to be insured against liability for Worker's $_{-61}$ -Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions, and

Contractor affirms to comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this Agreement. (Labor Code Section 3700)

- 3. CONTRACT BETWEEN SOLANO COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION AND SOLANO COMMUNITY COLLEGE – EARLY LEARNING CENTER 2023-2024

Solano Community College – Early Learning Center and the Solano County Office of Education (Solano COE) enter into this contract regarding the Solano Inclusive Early Education Expansion Program (IEEEP).

This contract will be in effect upon execution and remain in effect until June 30, 2024. **Solano COE** shall commence work on July 1, 2023, to offer **Teaching Pyramid Training Modules**, and the work shall be completed no later than June 30, 2024.

Solano Community College – Early Learning Center will provide compensation to a total of two (2) of its early learning teachers and staff (as shown on the attached attendance roster) who attended the **23/24 SCOE Teaching Pyramid Module Training Series,** for attendance outside of the employees' regular duty day, specifically on Saturdays throughout FY 2023/24. Extra duty compensation will be paid for a maximum of forty (40) hours of participation for each employee, based upon the number of hours completed for each individual staff member.

Upon submission of supporting documentation and invoice for payment, **Solano COE** agrees to reimburse **Solano Community College** – **Early Learning Center** for a maximum of 40 hours of extra duty compensation, including statutory benefits, for each employee who has participated in the Saturday **23/24 SCOE Teaching Pyramid Module Training Series**. Payment shall be made to **Solano Community College** – **Early Learning Center** by **Solano COE** within 30 days of receipt of invoice.

Solano COE shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the **Solano COE**, its officers, employees, agents, and volunteers against all claims, damages, losses, expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees), and liabilities (referred to collectively as "losses") of any kind or character arising out of and in the course of their performance under this Agreement. This obligation shall not lie in those instances where the losses are caused solely by the negligence or intentional misconduct of **Solano Community College – Early Learning Center,** its agents, or employees.

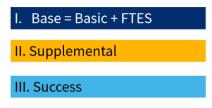
