RESOLUTION NO. 24/25-02

WHEREAS Assembly Bill 2229 (Wilson) – "Know Your Period Act" would ensure the inclusion of menstrual health education to the sexual health curriculum for middle and high school students.

WHEREAS The California Healthy Youth Act (AB 329) enacted in 2016 provides direction for middle and high school sexual health education. However, the resulting Education Code 51931 does not currently include comprehensive menstrual health education as part of sexual health curriculum requirements.

WHEREAS The lack of comprehensive menstrual health education can perpetuate social stigmas surrounding menstruation, leading to shame and poor health outcomes,

WHEREAS AB 2229 will help ensure that teens are educated regarding important menstrual health topics such as the menstrual cycle, premenstrual syndrome and pain management, menstrual disorders, and other related menstrual topics. The new menstrual health education will supplement the current sexual health curriculum.

WHEREAS Solano Community College student members of the Solano College Reproductive Health Club have played a pivotal role in building momentum, working with local representatives to introduce the legislation, and lobbying for its passage in each committee and house; now therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Governing Board of the Solano Community College Districts supports the passage of AB 2229 (Wilson) "Know Your Period" Act 2024

During the process of construction and RFI (Request for Information)/Submittal review, the following changes needed to be made:

- COR 004: During demolition of the concrete slab in Building 700 restrooms, it was discovered that the thickness of the slab was twice as thick as what was shown in the contract documents. This required additional demolition, disposal, and grading preparation.
- COR 006: The subgrade moisture content was above the acceptable amount for the parking lot sitework. The Contractor was instructed to over-excavate, add Geo Fabric, and the asphalt layer was increased to a 5" thickness in order to correct the issue.
- COR 008: The framing in restrooms 1519 and 1520 at the plumbing chase were discovered to be incompatible with the proposed ceiling framing. A revised ceiling framing plan was provided by the Design Team in order to correct the issue.
- COR 010: The existing door framing at restroom 738 was not sized correctly to allow for an accessible 3'-0" door. The door rough opening needed to be re-framed in order to accommodate the proper door dimension.
- COR 011.1: The existing main plumbing trunk line in rooms 1519 and 1520 needed to be relocated. The existing line was in a location that put it outside of the newly relocated walls. The existing plumbing needed to be removed back to the existing 2" cold water drop. A new shutoff valve and a 2" water line needed to be provided for the updated fixtures.
- COR 015: Duct work in Room 737 conflicted with the location of the intended light fixture. The specified light fixture needed to be substituted for a compatible light fixture in order to accommodate the interfering mechanical system.

Murray Building, Inc.'s Change Order #1 request includes all the costs of both time and materials for the above listed items.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE AGREEMENT

This Renewal Agreement is between **Solano County Office of Education** (hereinafter known as HEALTH CENTER) located at **5100 Business Center Drive**, **Fairfield**, **Ca 94534**, and **Solano Community College** (hereinafter known as SCHOOL) and located at **4000 Suisun Valley Road**, **Fairfield**, **California 94534-3197** and is effective as of July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2027.

RECITALS

- A. The Solano County Office of Education (SCOE) operates schools and programs throughout Solano County for students with disabilities, medial conditions, and other special needs, pre-K through 12th grade. (hereinafter referred to as "Facility").
- B. SCHOOL owns and operates an Associate Degree Nursing Program (ADN) which is accredited by the California Board of Registered Nursing. SCHOOL desires its students to obtain practical experience at HEALTH CENTER's Facility through participation in a clinical program for its Registered Nursing students ("Program").
- C. It is to the mutual benefit of the parties to this Agreement that the students at SCHOOL's Program use such Facility for their clinical experience.

Now, therefore, the parties agree as follows:

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

- A. Both parties before the beginning of the training shall agree upon the period of time for each student's clinical experience.
- B. The maximum number of students to receive training shall be mutually agreed upon by the parties at least 30 days prior to beginning of training based upon the availability of space and other considerations.
- C. School faculty and appropriate facility staff will arrange for faculty and student orientations and identify a process for ongoing communication between the facility and the school at the beginning of each clinical experience.
- D. Faculty and appropriate facility staff will annually review the appropriateness of the learning environment in relation to the program's written objectives.

2. SCHOOL'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. <u>Student Profile</u>. SCHOOL shall complete and send to HEALTH CENTER a profile for each student enrolled in the Program which shall include the student's name, address and telephone number, driver's license number and social security number, prior to the beginning of the planned clinical experience.
- B. <u>Schedule of Assignments</u>. SCHOOL shall notify the HEATH CENTER of its planned schedule of student assignments, including the name of the student, level of academic preparation and length and dates of clinical experience prior to the planned clinical experience.
- C. <u>Program Coordinator</u>. SCHOOL shall designate a faculty member to coordinate with a designee of HEALTH CENTER in the planning of the Program to be provided students.
- D. <u>Records</u>. SCHOOL shall maintain all personnel and academic records of the students.

The various rights, options, elections, powers, and remedies of the respective parties hereto contained in, granted, or reserved by this Agreement, are in addition to any others that said parties may be entitled to by law, shall be construed as cumulative, and no one of them is exclusive of any of the others, or of any right or priority allowed by law.
- K. <u>Severability</u>. The provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed severable and if any portion shall be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable for any reason, the remainder of this Agreement shall be effective and binding upon the parties.
- L. <u>Waiver of Provisions</u>. Any waiver of any terms and conditions hereof must be in writing and signed by the parties hereto. A waiver of any term or condition hereof shall not be construed as a future waiver of the same or any other term or condition hereof.
- M. Compliance with Law and Regulatory Agencies. HEALTH CENTER and SCHOOL shall comply with all applicable provisions of law and other valid rules and regulations of all governmental agencies having jurisdiction over: (i) the operation of the HEALTH CENTER; (ii) the licensing of health care practitioners; and (iii) the delivery of services to patients of governmentally regulated third party payers whose members/beneficiaries receive care from HEALTH CENTER. This shall specifically include compliance with applicable provisions of Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations. SCHOOL shall also comply with all applicable standards and recommendations of the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, bylaws and rules and regulations, and policies and procedures of HEALTH CENTER its Medical Staff and Medical Staff departments.

A College Bookstore shall be established and operated by either by the District or by a qualified vendor.

If the District is to provide the bookstore services:

- Operational costs of the college bookstore shall be paid from revenue earned from the bookstore
- Fiscal management of the Bookstore shall be in accordance with the California Community Colleges Budget and Accounting Manual. An annual audit of the records and accounts of the Bookstore shall be provided to the Governing Board.

If a qualified vendor is to provide bookstore services:

• Contracts for outside vendors to operate bookstores shall be awarded by competitive bid, submitted to the Board for approval, and awarded in the best interests of the students. Student organizations shall be encouraged to submit bids and given preference if they meet all other bid criteria.

The College Bookstore shall comply with the requirements of the Reader Privacy Act.
